## **IITGn students to revisit ancient India**

### **A workshop on the history of India will be conducted for the students**

Young researchers from across the country will converge for a three-day history workshop at Indian Institute of Technology Gandhinagar (IITGn).

The graduate students workshop on “The History and Archaeology of Ancient India” organised by Archaeological Sciences Centre at IITGn will begin from January 30.

Over 20 students from various universities from around the country will present their research papers in the workshop. As a part of the Graduate Students Workshop, young research scholars from across the country will present their papers, covering topics such as Buddhist architecture, what can be called ‘literary archaeology’, sites of archaeological significance in Himalayan and Trans-Himalayan sites, and so on.

The event will kick-off with a keynote address by Professor of History at University of Delhi, Dr Upinder Singh, and a well-known expertise in the historiography of ancient India.

Professor Srinivas Reddy at IIT Gandhinagar said, “The focus of the workshop is to support and highlight young Indian scholars conducting research on ancient India. When we support our young students, we create a culture of research that will inspire generations.”
