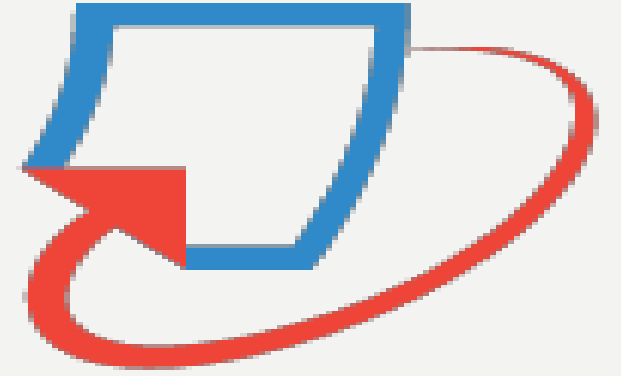

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# PLAGIARISM

- Plagiarism is the wrongful appropriation and stealing and publication of another author's language, thoughts, ideas, or expressions and the representation of them as one's own original work. Plagiarism is considered as academic dishonesty and a breach of publisher ethics.
- It is subject to sanctions like penalties, suspension, and even expulsion of university licenses.
- Plagiarism is presently considered more as a case of copyright infringement. However, regulatory bodies in India are working to cover it as an academic and intellectual crime with the upcoming academic session.
- UGC and other academic bodies have made it mandatory for the institutions to have institutional level antiplagiarism software to vet the research papers of the institution.

# COMMON FORMS OF PLAGIARISM

- Submitting someone's work as their own.
- Taking passages from their own previous work without adding citations.
- Re-writing someone's work without properly citing sources.
- Using quotations, but not citing the source.
- Interweaving various sources together in the work without citing.
- Citing some, but not all passages that should be cited.
- Melding together cited and uncited sections of the piece.
- Providing proper citations, but fails to change the structure and wording of the borrowed ideas enough.
- Inaccurately citing the source.
- Relying too heavily on other people's work. Fails to bring original thought into the text.

# SANCTIONS FOR PLAGIARISM

- In the academic world, plagiarism is usually considered a very serious offense that can result in punishments such as a failing grade on the particular assignment, the entire course, or even being expelled from the institution.
- Generally, the punishment increases as a person enters higher institutions of learning.
- University/College accreditation can be cancelled/downgraded if there is lot of plagiarism detected in the research papers submitted by it's students.

- Planning your paper:
- Consult with your instructor
- plan your paper
- take effective notes
- Writing your paper:
- when in doubt, cite sources.
- make it clear who said what
- know how to paraphrase
- analyze and evaluate your source
